## CATHOLIC MINISTRY APPEAL PROVIDES A PATH OF HOPE TO THOSE IN NEED

The annual Archdiocesan Catholic Ministries Appeal (CMA) will be taking place starting this month (January) and into February 2017. A kick-off appeal message will be shared at Sunday Masses over the weekend of January 21/22, followed by Commitment Weekend on February 4/5.

Catholic Ministries provide a path of hope for Catholics in the Archdiocese of Cincinnati. These ministries are:

- Catholic Charities and Social Services
- Campus, hospital, and prison ministries
- Seminary and vocations
- St. Rita School for the Deaf
- Retired Archdiocesan Priests
- New Evangelization

Each ministry depends on donations from the faith-filled Catholics of our archdiocese to provide a key part of their budget each year. As a once-a-year outreach, the Catholic Ministries Appeal unites the parishes of our Archdiocese together to support these ministries, accomplishing more than one parish could do alone.

The Archdiocese's goal for the 2017 CMA is \$5 million. Ninety cents of every dollar contributed goes directly to fund the ministries. Parishes that exceed their CMA goal will receive 50% of the "overage" for use in their own parish ministries and evangelization efforts. ## ONE FAITH, ONE HOPE, ONE LOVE CAMPAIGN BEGINS THE PROCESS TO AWARD SCHOLARSHIPS FOR CATHOLIC EDUCATION

The initial availability of tuition assistance flowing from the One Faith, One Hope, One Love campaign through the Catholic Education Foundation will begin with the 2017-18 school year. Schools

will begin actively recruiting and enrolling students in late January 2017 in conjunction with the annual celebration of Catholic Schools Week. Applications for funds available for tuition assistance are being accepted now so that families will learn of assistance that could be available to them when they visit schools during Catholic Schools Week at the end of January. Both elementary and high school students are eligible for the tuition funds up to \$1000 per student and anyone who is interested is encouraged to apply as soon as possible, whether their child is currently enrolled in a Catholic school or they would like them to be. - If you are not feeling well, refrain from shaking hands at the Sign of Peace

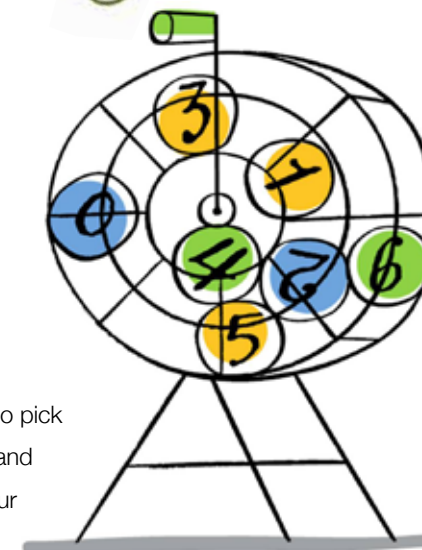


November's annual Fall Festival was a wonderful opportunity to share time with family and fellow parishioners!

### Is Key To A Vibrant Parish Region




In a 2013 Catholic Telegraph article about the creation of pastoral regions, Fr. Tom Seibert, then pastor for the newly formed Dayton pastoral region said, "We have a good group of people who are looking at the bigger picture. They understand this is what we have to do.... You have to be very open to sharing responsibility, to encouraging lay people to step up and share their gifts. That's what has been happening here."
